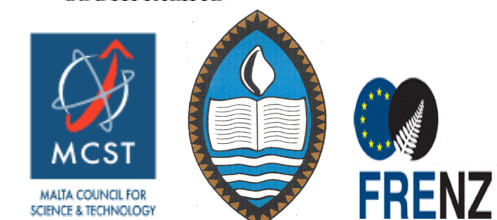

## ABOUT PACE-NET...

PACE-Net aims to coordinate bi-regional dialogue in Science and Technology (S&T) between Pacific countries and the European Union (EU), as well as to strengthen S&T cooperation between these regions. Based on the objectives and activities of International Cooperation (Inco-NET) under the Capacities Programme (FP7), the PACE-Net project will focus on the scientific context of the Pacific region.

The project will list existing activities of cooperation and will identify priorities for Pacific-related research that are of common interest for the EU. This state-of-the-art will allow us to find synergies between bilateral and multilateral European and Pacific programmes, to design the necessary tools to facilitate co-operation and to develop a European strategy of a collaboration policy in S&T with the Pacific, in particular through FP7 and other EU programmes.
